Interracial marriage in Islaam

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بسم الله لرحمن لرجيم

In the Name of Allaah the most Kind the most Merciful

Allaah (سحك) said:

يَ ا ظِيُّهُ اَ النَّاسِ لِنَّا لَخَوَّنْ لَكُم مِّن لَكُر وَلَثْهَى وَجَكُفْ كَمْشِ عِيًّا وَضَكَائِلَ لِثَا حَافِ وَا إِنَّ لَكُرَ لَمِكُمْ حَيْدَ الشِّبِلَقُّ كَمْ [O mankind, indeed We have created you from male and female and made you nations and tribes that you may know one another. Indeed, the most noble of you in the sight of Allaah is the most righteous of you.]²

And the Prophet (﴿ اللهُ عَنَيْهِ وَاللَّهُ ﴾ married Fatimah bint Qays from the tribe of Qur'aysh to Usamah ibn Zayd and he was a freed slave; the Prophet (غيي طاصلاة والسلام) freed him.

And Abdurrahmaan ibn Awf from the tribe of Qur'aysh married his sister to Bilaal ibn Rabah the Ethiopian; while she was from the noble Qur'aysh. Thus this affair is broad, and all praises belong to Allaah.

And Zayd ibn Haarith married Zaynab bint Jahsh the paternal cousin of the Prophet (غين العداد). Therefore the matter is broad and all praises belong to Allaah. The important thing is the religion. If the woman desires to marry him and he is religious, and he is known for his religion, then all praises belong to Allaah.

Translator's note:

Usamah ibn Zayd: His mother was Umm Ayman Barakah from Ethiopia. She was from the caretakers of the Prophet (غيه الماصلة والسلام) during his infancy. She died during the rule of Uthmaan bin Affan. His father was Zayd ibn Haarith the freed slave of the Prophet (غيم الماصلة والسلام)

The Tribe of Qur'aysh are the best of the Arabs. (183/7(مجموع عنداوى بلن عجيم عن المحاملة)

Abdurrahmaan ibn Awf is from the ten companions promised Paradise in the narration collected by At-Tirmidhee.
